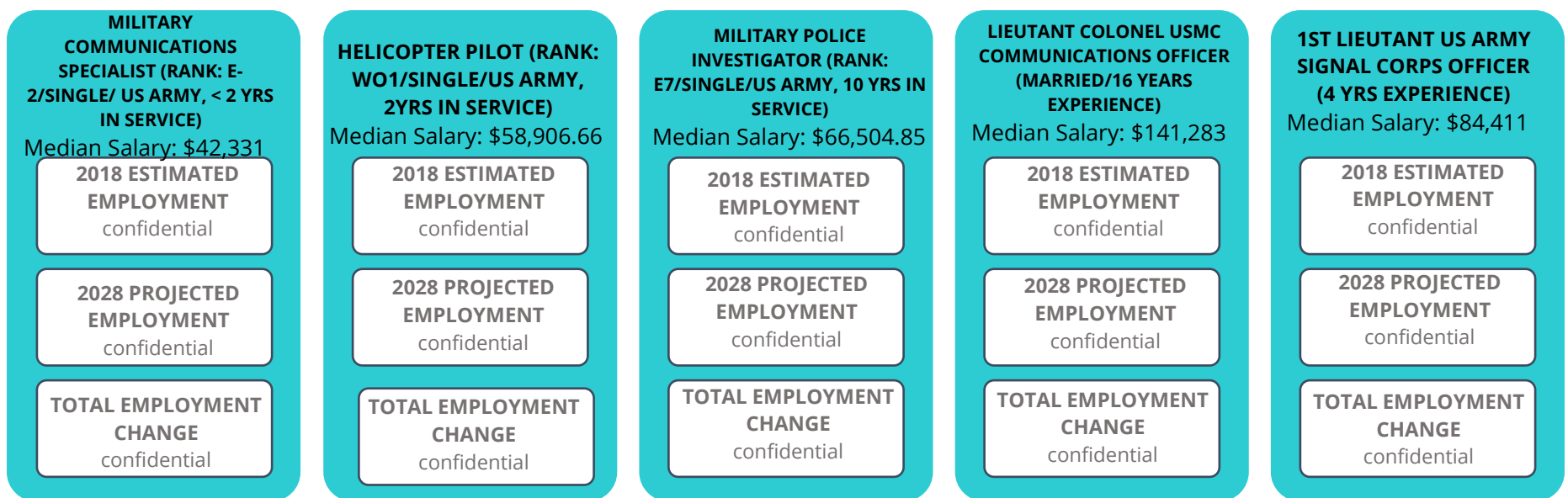
JOB OUTLOOK

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics' Standard Occupational Classification System, job opportunities within the Department of Defense should be very good for qualified individuals in all branches of the armed forces through 2028. All services have entry-level and professional position needs to fill as current members of the armed forces move up through the ranks, leave the service, or retire. OCCUPATION PROFILE

Careers in the military reflect those in civilian life giving enlisted personnel a wide variety of career choices. These five careers are an integral part of the military as they support and protect troops. Communications specialists and signal corps officers operate and maintain communication systems. Helicopter pilots use helicopters to transport personnel, equipment, and supplies. Military police investigators are law enforcement professionals within military forces.



PROGRAM OF STUDY PROFILE

Leadership in Government is designed for students planning careers as public servants at the local, state, or federal levels of government including the Department of Defense. Students successfully completing a minimum of two years in a JROTC program may enter a military career pathway with advanced rank and increased salary benefits.
